# Official Order For The Departure Of Draft Men Received in Elmira; Plan Big Reception in Their Honor

Mayor Harry N. Hoffman of City Draft Board and Philip Wynkoop of County Draft Board in Possession of Order, Which Will Take 50 Elmira and 59 County Residents to Camp Upton February 26—Men to Go From County Are Selected and City List Will Be Available Tomorrow—Home Defense Committee Is Planning Reception.

Official orders for the entrainment of the 109 city and county draft soldiers were received this morning by Mayor Hoffman, chairman of the city draft board, and Philip Wynkoop, chairman of the county draft board. As told in the Star-Gazette yesterday 50 soldiers are called from the city and 59 from the county.

The city soldiers are to leave over the Lackawanna on a special train scheduled to arrive here from the west at 11:55 o'clock Tuesday night, February 26. The soldiers are scheduled to arrive at Camp Upton at 12 o'clock noon, the following day.

The county soldiers are scheduled to leave Tuesday morning at 1:35 o'clock over the Erie on a special train from the west. At Binghamton 67 additional soldiers from Broome county will be taken on board. This train is scheduled to arrive in that city at 3:15 a. m. The train schedule shows that the soldiers will be allowed to leave the train at Port Jervis for breakfast. The train is to arrive at Jersey City at 9:35 and at 11 a. m. the soldiers are to board a boat at Long Island City and be delivered at Camp Upton at 1:30 p. m.

Mobilization orders for this, the last contingent of the first draft quotas from Elmira and Chemung county, were received today by city and county boards.

One of the important regulations is that there MUST be NO liquor in this special train. The city and county board members must search every soldier and his baggage and see that no liquor is taken by the new soldiers. When a former contingent of soldiers were taken from western and southern New York state there was much complaint of men being intoxicated and drinking on the train. Civilians who accompanied the Elmira draft soldiers said the Elmira and Chemung county boys did not indulge in liquor, but soldiers boys from other cities acted in a manner not in compliance with the rules and regulations of the army.

#### COPY OF ORDER.

The following is a copy of the mobilization orders received by the local board:

"White men only will be included in this movement.

"These men will entrain from Elmira and arrive at Camp Upton.

"Liquor will not be allowed on board this train and in order to enforce this direction, you are directed to search the pockets and baggage of the men and to seize and destroy any liquor found.

"Sentries will be placed at each door of cars with instructions not to allow men to leave car on stoppage of train. Arrangement for relief of these sentries is in discretion of board, which may delegate authority to men in charge of party.

"Transportation requests will be presented to the ticket office at the entraining point in exchange for railway tickets.

"Box lunches will be furnished in

his name within a day or two. The official city list will be announced as soon as compiled, probably tomorrow.

Chairman Booth is planning to have the reception given the county soldiers on Monday night. If the City Draft board so desires the reception for the city soldiers will be given at the same time. The names of the speakers and program will not be announced until after the Chemung County Home Defense Committee holds a meeting.

## TWO DRAFT MEN QUARANTINED

Secretary of County Selection Board Receives Word That George Loren Dexter and Fred Dexter Have Chicken-pox.

Secretary Mark Banfield of the Chemung County Selection board today received word that George Loren Dexter, formerly of Breesport and Fred Cecil Dexter, formerly of Breesport, are quarantined at Crooked Creek, Pa. Both these young registrants are in the call for service with the country contingent which leaves here next Tuesday. It is said that there is an epidemic of chicken pox at Crooked Creek and both men are under quarantine with many others. Whether the quarantine will be raised in time for the registrants to report here for entraining next Tuesday or not remains to be learned.
